REFLECTION

Father Raymond: The Unshakeable Love of God:

“Though the mountains be shaken and the hills be removed, yet my unfailing love for you will not be shaken nor my covenant of peace be removed,” says the Lord, who has compassion on you (Isaiah 54:10).

When the sea is calm, even the unskilled sailor may guide the ship; but when the waves rise high and the winds roar, then the true pilot is revealed. So it is with the soul: in times of ease, even the faint-hearted may seem steadfast; but in the hour of trial, only the one anchored in hope remains unmoved.

When the prophet speaks of mountains (in Isaiah 54:10) falling and hills turning to dust, he is not merely describing the crumbling of the earth, but the shaking of all that seems secure in our lives. Mountains are symbols of strength, permanence, and stability. Hills are the gentle guardians of our valleys. Yet even these, the prophet says, may pass away.

Hear the promise of the Lord: *“Yet my love will stand.”* This is not the love of man, which is often fickle and bound by conditions. This is the eternal, steadfast love of the Creator — the love that called the universe into being, the love that took on flesh in Christ, the love that endured the cross for our salvation.

If mountains fall, His love remains. If the hills turn to dust, His mercy endures. If the storms of life rage, His hand still upholds us. For His love is not built on the soil of this world, but on the unshakable foundation of His own divine nature.

Therefore, let us not anchor our hope in what can be moved, but in Him who cannot be moved. Let us remember that even in the ruins of our plans, the Lord is building something eternal.

And so, when the mountains of your life crumble, do not despair. Lift your eyes to the One whose love never fails, and you will find that even in the dust, there is life — for His love is the rock that no storm can break.
